Since 1977, Disability Alliance BC has been a provincial, cross-disability voice in British Columbia. To fulfill our mission we:

- Provide one-to-one assistance for people with all disabilities
- Produce and provide publications free of charge
- Design and implement programs and special projects
- Provide workshops and webinars on disability-related programs and services
- Work closely with community partners to promote positive change for people with disabilities

Advocacy Access Program

We help people to access provincial (PWD/PPMB) and federal (CPP-D) benefits, and medical services and supplies available to PWD/PPMB recipients. We provide help with applications and appeals (service provided by appointment only).



Tax AID DABC

We help people receiving PWD or PPMB to file their income taxes. Our service is available all year, and our specialty is helping people file multiple years of taxes.

Access RDSP

This program is a partnership with BC Aboriginal Network on Disability Society and Plan Institute. We help with all aspects of opening a Registered Disability Savings Plan, including the Disability Tax Credit. rdsp@disabilityalliancebc.org
