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Four of the many ways we help people living with disabilities:

- 1. Advocacy Access** - Is our main direct service. The people we help through this program live on extremely low incomes or in poverty, and many are homeless. In 2017 we provided direct in-person service to over 800 individuals, helping them to obtain provincial and federal disability benefits and other supports including diet allowances and mobility aids. We also responded to over 2000 information requests and provided 25 workshops to 744 people.
- 2. Tax Aid DABC** - We provide income tax filing assistance to people with disabilities who have fallen behind. Since July 2015 we have helped file 1,748 years of taxes for a total of over \$1.3 million in credits or benefits.
- 3. Right Fit Pilot Project** - This is a 3 year project in partnership with the Individualized Funding Resource Centre and other key stakeholders including BC Housing and the Ministry of Social Development and Poverty Reduction. The project's objective is to match wheelchair users with fully accessible housing units.
- 4. Violence Prevention Work** - In December 2017 we launched a series of 6 videos and guides to help people with disabilities increase their understanding of the procedures and processes they will go through if they have been a victim of crime.

Fall Fling Gala

The annual Fall Fling Gala is a chance for us to celebrate people living with disabilities and those who employ them. Every year we host a dinner, a live and silent auction, have a fun quiz game, and present DABC's Employment Awards.

Money raised from the Fall Fling Gala goes towards funding our programs and projects, designed to help British Columbians with disabilities live with dignity and independence in the community.
